Other Primary Care

Nurse Practitioner

A nurse practitioner, or NP, is an advanced practice registered nurse who works under the supervision of a physician. NPs have higher education and training in a particular area, such as diabetes or primary care.

Physician Assistant

Physician assistants, PAs, practice medicine under the direction and supervision of a licensed physician.

A licensed health care professional who practices under the supervision of a physician and is skilled in promoting and maintaining health.
